

## Arrest Made in Museum Theft, Other Break-Ins

On December 2, 2025, at 8:15 a.m., the Summit County Sheriff's Office responded to the MAPS Air Museum located on International Parkway in the City of Green. An employee noticed a lock had been broken off the front door and items were missing inside of the museum. The missing items included an electric bicycle and a rifle. The Summit County Sheriff's Office Detective Bureau responded to the scene and detectives located the bicycle nearby. The crime scene was processed by investigators.

Later that day, at approximately 3:00 p.m., the Sheriff's Office responded to a business on Greensburg Road in the City of Green. As the owner was entering the building, he saw a suspect running out of the building wearing the owner's hat and sunglasses. The owner called the Sheriff's Office. Responding deputies were able to locate and detain the suspect near the intersection of Massillon Road and Greensburg Road. Detectives responded and determined it was the same suspect responsible for the break-in at the MAPS Air Museum, as well as a recent break-in at the Greensburg Park concession stand earlier that morning.

The stolen rifle was located by a Sheriff's Office K-9 unit in a wooded area in Green. The items stolen from the concession stand were also recovered.

The suspect was identified as Derrick Duck, age 43 of Palatka, Florida. He was arrested and charged with Theft (F-4), Breaking & Entering (F-4), Theft of a Firearm (F-4), Weapons Under Disability (F-3), and Criminal Damaging (M-4). He was transported to the Summit County Jail.
